- Venue: Greenbank Pony Club, Campbell Rd, Greenbank
- Start Time: Gear Check 7.45am, 8:00am Dressage
- X Country Course will be open for walking Sat after 3pm to 10am Sunday. Please do not walk through the dressage arenas once the dressage has commenced.
Showjumping will be run throughout the day so riders may SJ before their XC Riders Briefing – Class 7 at completion of your class Showjumping
All other classes after completion of all Dressage
XC jump steward briefing – Follows Class 7 rider's briefing
- Attendee Checkin: From 6.00am, all riders and attendees must sign in via a register at the Club House
- Entry Fee: \$55 **only one horse per rider due to number restrictions**

- Nominations: All nominations are to be lodged online by logging onto your PCA Online Account.
Late nominates will be \$65
One helper/ penciller will be required for every rider nominated. Helper details are to be recorded at time of nomination. Rider's Club to ensure helping positions are filled. **No helpers = No riders.**
Entries will be capped at 70 riders with preference to riders in Official classes if the need arises. No transferring of classes after entries close, unless horse has upgraded. If rider transfers class after walking XC course, then rider will ride HC in new class.
- Entries Close: Friday 14th August 2020 or once cap is reached
- Rules: Run under PCAQ rules. <https://www.equestrian.org.au/Eventing-Dressage-tests>
Medical armbands & body protectors must be worn in x country phase
Only one horse per rider due to number restrictions.
Judges' decision is final and there will be no discussion taken with the judge, you must lodge a protest accompanied by \$50.
The club reserves the right to refuse an entry with or without providing a reason.
- Protests: Must be within 30 minutes of result posting, accompanied by \$50 fee.
- Refunds: Will be made providing the organizing body is advised of the scratching before the commencement of the event and a written request including a vet or doctor's certificate is sent to the organizing committee within a week of the event. A 10% administration fee may be retained.
- Draw: Draw will be available on our Facebook page by 10pm, Friday 21 August 2020.
- Back Numbers: Riders need to collect paper numbers at checkin. Please bring your own back number holder.
- Performance Cards: Completed Performance cards are required for classes 1 – 6, must be handed to in prior to the commencement of event. Rider cannot compete above the grade stated on the card. Able to ride down as per 2020 Rule Book. Performance card number must be on the nomination. If rider does not have card on the day of competition, awards will be with held until it is produced. Noms with no performance card number and rider does not have card on the day, rider will compete HC
- HHD: Horse Health Declarations to be handed in prior to the start of the event.
- Weather: In case of inclement weather check Facebook event page

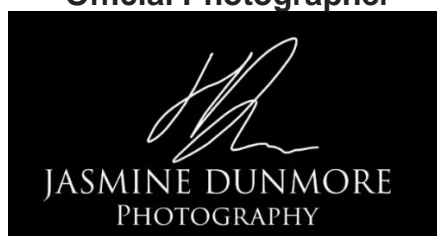

BIOSECURITY FACT SHEET



We take biosecurity seriously and have measures in place to mitigate the risk of infections, diseases and pests.

OUR BIOSECURITY POLICY

All horse owners and competitors should be aware that you have a biosecurity obligation to take all reasonable steps to ensure your activities do not spread a pest, disease or contaminant.

Competitors are asked to ensure good biosecurity practices at home and at the event and to follow the instructions of the organising committee and the Biosecurity Manager or risk expulsion from the event. All horses entering grounds must be from a property actively practising good biosecurity principles within their management.

Horse Health Declarations (HHD) are a mandatory requirement for all events. Please read the HHD form and ensure:

Your horses are shampooed, rinsed and allowed to dry, and their hooves are picked clean of all solid material and washed with shampoo

Your vehicles and equipment accompanying the horses are cleaned to remove all solid material that could contain disease agents, and then disinfected.

Acceptance into the event will be refused if the required HHD is not presented at point of entry or designated registration point, as advised by the organising committee.

The property identification code (PIC) of the horse's origin must be included on the HHD.

Other biosecurity and workplace health and safety measures that aim to provide the safest environment for horses, competitors, volunteers and visitors include:

- No horses or dogs with signs of illness are to be brought onto the grounds
- No communal horse water troughs are available at this event
- Do not share equipment, including food and water containers, between horses.
- Competitors are responsible for cleaning up manure from yards and placing it in designated areas. Please use your own rake/shovels
- Competitors are required to advise the event organisers immediately if a horse is sick. Stop all non-essential contact with the sick horse. Do not allow children to have close contact with the sick horse.
- Everyone handling horses should wash or sanitise hands between contacting different horses.

OUR BIOSECURITY PLAN

Our event biosecurity plan is a set of preventative control measures and actions aimed at reducing the risk of infectious diseases and pests on and off the venue, and between horses at the venue.

WHAT TO EXPECT IN THE UNLIKELY EVENT OF A BIOSECURITY INCIDENT

In the unlikely event of a biosecurity incident, the Biosecurity Manager and the organizing committee will implement our event biosecurity plan.

You will be notified about the incident and expected to follow the directions given by the organising committee.

Everyone will be expected to remain at the venue until cleared to leave by the organising committee and Biosecurity Manager.

In the event of horse movement restrictions participants are responsible for the care, maintenance and cost of their horses and themselves, including feeding, bedding, vets and personal needs.

If a horse is confirmed to have an infectious diseases the owner/ lessee will be responsible for all vet cost and if venue is locked down and quarantined will be responsible for all cost associated with this.
